The last board meeting was held January 11, 2026. Highlights include a review of the Celebration of the Season, which was held in December. It was a terrific event and those who attended had a great time. However, attendance was low for the 2nd year in a row and the future of the event is in question. From the Facilities area, the Wormfarm Institute will be renting Park Hall for their fall major workshop, Decomposition. The event will take place October 9-11, 2026 and are expecting over 500 people to come through our congregation. There were many Buildings and Grounds updates, including: Elevator - will be replaced during the 2nd week of March and we show have a new operational elevator by April; Bathroom Update - Susie Tatone is currently painting and adding flooring to the bathrooms; Building Updates - the Building and Grounds Committee is fixing the decking on the west porch, mud jacking the sidewalk on the east side of the building, cleaning the gutters, and fixing the flat roof on the backside of the building; Spring Clean-Up - Gil Williams is planning to organize a spring cleanup of our grounds. Omar's (he/him) work has focused on supporting regenerative farmers in incorporating perennials into their farming systems. His philosophy embraces the wisdom of traditional practices and the power of creative imagination. Blending his technical expertise in soil science and agroecology with his artistic sensibilities he makes complex concepts accessible and inspiring. This unique blend has had a transformative impact on the agricultural landscapes he's worked with, enhancing both productivity and farmer livelihoods.

Facility Use Agreement Proposal:

Decomposium 2026 is a three-day public symposium exploring themes of decomposition, renewal, and ecological cycles through art, science, music, food, and conversation. The event will take place October 9–11, 2026, with the historic Park Hall in Sauk City serving as the primary indoor venue, with additional programming in the adjacent Free Thinkers Park, the Free Thinkers Annex on Slotty Road, and field trips to select partner sites.

Produced by Wormfarm Institute, the Decomposium will bring together approximately 30 artists, soil scientists, farmers, musicians, and cultural practitioners to lead a mix of panel discussions, lectures, workshops, performances, exhibitions, and guided experiences. Programming will run throughout the day and early evening across all three days, with Park Hall hosting the majority of Friday and Saturday sessions requiring seating, A/V support, and ADA accessibility.

We anticipate welcoming approximately 1,000 attendees over three days, drawing a mix of Sauk County residents and regional visitors. Most events will be free and open to the public, with advance registration required for many sessions to manage capacity. Attendees are expected to be respectful, curious, and intergenerational, reflecting Wormfarm's long history of producing public cultural events.

Park Hall was intentionally selected for its location in Sauk Prairie, historical significance, and alignment with values of free inquiry and open dialogue. The tone of the event will be thoughtful, engaging, occasionally provocative, but always welcoming and non-confrontational. Sessions will engage topics such as death and regeneration, soil, and ecological change through a cultural lens, inviting thoughtful public engagement.

The event will require standard venue support, including room setup flexibility, seating, and A/V capabilities for speakers and performances. Outdoor spillover programming in the adjacent park will help manage flow and create a festival-like atmosphere without overwhelming the hall itself.

Decomposium builds on Wormfarm Institute's 25-year track record of producing large-scale, well-run public events in Sauk County and the region. We view Park Hall not only as a venue, but as a meaningful partner in hosting this cultural gathering, which connects agriculture, ecology, art, and community at a human scale.

- Saturday, October 10th: Scientific Discussions, Art Installations, Performances, and Rituals at Park Hall. Wormfarm Institute is current seeking proposals until February 9th – <https://www.wormfarminstitute.org/programs/current/decomp26> (10 hours)
- Sunday, October 11th: Field Trips to Partner Sites, Closing Afternoon Program at Slotty Road Cemetery (5 hours)
- Monday, October 12th: Clean Up at Park Hall and Shotty Road Cemetery (Approximately 4 hours)

Total Hours – Between 37-41 hours

Financial Proposal: \$2,000 for space rental, plus an additional \$150 if they need to use our sound system.

This is a discounted amount from our Space Rental Contract Fees because the Wormfarm Institute has limited financial resources. In exchange for the rate discount, the Wormfarm Institute would recognize the Free Congregation of Sauk County(FCSC) as an event co-sponsor.

- As such, FCSC would be listed on all marketing materials, along with verbal recognition at on-site events.
- Such recognition supports our stated goal of expanding facility awareness and congregation growth.
