174th Painesfest Holiday Program and Potluck

We will welcome **Guest Speaker Dan Kapust** for our **174th Painesfest Holiday**, at **10:10 a.m.**, on **Sunday, January 25**, in **Park Hall**. The program topic will be **Common Sense (Paine's invocation of 1 Samuel)**. In his book, **Common Sense**, Thomas Paine argued against monarchy; surprisingly, this argument employed a revolutionary and innovative use of scripture, specifically this verse: [1 Samuel 8](#). Dr. Daniel Kapust is the **Judith Hicks Stiehm Professor of Political Theory** in the Department of Political Science at the University of Wisconsin, Madison. He is also the Director of the College of Letters & Science Honors Program. This is his 3rd presentation at Painesfest, our celebration of the birth of Thomas Paine, an American revolutionary whose writings on liberty, democracy, and the separation of church and state were especially influential among German Free Thought groups. Author of **Common Sense**, Paine is considered an American Founding Father. First celebrated in January 1853, we commemorate Paine's life each January.

Some thoughts for a good friend Mike Irwin:

Mike Irwin won the game of life at an early age. He slammed the home-run score in the local baseball league championship and was doused with champagne in the celebration parade. It doesn't get any better than that!

But his life was not downhill. He continued to grow as a talented member of the community, active in social events, knowledgeable about issues, and ever eager to be of help to others. I was honored to be his friend.

We would often meet to ponder issues of life and consume a glass of bubbly as we solved problems confronting the world. He introduced me to the Greek philosopher Lucretius, thoughts about Buddhism, issues about weather and farming and growing special seeds for international distribution. He did his homework. It was easy to see the magnetic energy he could instill in others as a teacher, investigative reporter, actor, and poet. He interviewed the Dalai Lama, Travelled the Orient express, taught young folks from Sauk County a thing or two about presenting themselves before audiences. But the essence of his actions centered on his ability to think and feel about issues relating to the improvement of the human condition.

He will be missed and remembered.
