#### **Notes from the Portraits on the Wall Committee**

The committee previously raised enough money to add two women on our walls: **Mary Wollstonecraft** and **Elizabeth Cady Stanton**. There was not enough money to purchase a frame, and the committee unanimously voted to replace Friedrich Schiller, using that frame for Elizabeth Cady Stanton.

The committee received a generous donation of \$5000.00 from an anonymous Chicago donor to support more women on our walls; we had many men and only 2 women. That money was used to add 5 full size portraits of 5 Free Thinkers, 4 of which were women: Lucy G. Parsons, Anne Nicol Gaylor, Helen Hamilton Gardener, and Cecile Richards; with the permission of the donor, some of this money was used to upgrade Thomas Paine's portrait.

Since Thomas Paine and Mary Wollstonecraft were renowned contemporaries who knew one another and supported similar causes, the committee decided to honor both by placing both portraits on the front wall, next to the windows and above the stage. As you can see by the title of their books they overlapped in many ways: Mary Wollstonecraft, who wrote, <u>A Vindication of the Rights of Men</u> (1790) and <u>A Vindication of the Rights of Women</u> (1792), and Thomas Paine, who wrote <u>Common Sense</u>, <u>Rights of Man</u> (1776).

The congregation was promoted at Cow Chip '25 with an informational table on Saturday, August 30. Please thank our volunteers when you have the chance: Susie Tatone, Ellen Paul, Dave Siegfried, and Lynne Roberts.
